SUPERVISOR COMMENTS

Officers responded to a domestic battery after the victim reported her husband grabbed her by the throat and shoved her onto the couch. The incident occurred over the male having thoughts of his wife cheating on him. He was arrested and booked in jail. An officer contacted a male in an alley way and determined he had outstanding bookable warrants. While searching the male the officer located methamphetamine in his pocket.

After checking his criminal history it was determined he had several prior convictions for possession of hard drugs and was charged accordingly. An off-duty Deputy called in a possible drunk driver and officers located the vehicle after it was involved in a collision. The investigation led to a DWI arrest and the driver was booked.

SUPERVISOR COMMENTS

This was the first day of the week for the graveyard shift. Officers were kept very busy, mostly from self-initiated calls. During the night, officers made several arrests, 3 being for DUI and a narcotics arrest. One of the DUI arrests consisted of a vehicle that was observed by an officer who was returning from the jail at 2306 hours. He saw a gray sedan speeding south bound on Hwy 99, approximately 120 mph, with its lights turned off. The officer turned on his lights and siren, but the vehicle failed to yield. After a short pursuit, the vehicle finally yielded in the 3000 block of W. Monte Vista. The driver was extremely intoxicated, and officers also found a 3-yr. old child in the back seat. The driver was arrested for attempting to flee, DUI, and child endangerment. She was taken to jail.
