She collided into the house and then fled on foot and was quickly picked up by another vehicle that left the area. Luckily, the injuries to the tree trimmer were not life threatening. Follow-up is being done to identify the driver for felony hit and run charges. This afternoon an officer handled a mental health call where a female left messages to friends and family that she was going drive off of a cliff. She was determined to be in the Patterson area and then the bay area but had not been located yet.
